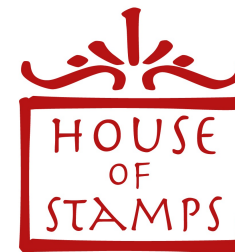

Lyndon contributes over 28 years of experience to the class. He's an award winning artist who loves to share his knowledge with novice jewelers and with those seeking to improve their existing skills.

Through this five-day retreat, not only will you be introduced to Navajo techniques of stamp work; you will explore the relationship between the Navajo history of stamps and stamping tools in jewelry through educational opportunities and experiences in direct participation and immersion within the Navajo community.

You will come away with new skills and finished pieces. You will work primarily with sterling silver and copper. You will use torch, jeweler's saw, hammers, polishing wheel, bezel setting, and more. You will hone your stamping techniques; learn how to skillfully use metal and build upon jewelry metalsmithing.
